International Women's Day

RFPS celebrated International Women's Day (a little later for us this year) on Wednesday and the theme was #choosetochallenge. Each year group did the pose for this year, with our hands up to show we were in!

Each year group chose an influential sporting female to study. Reception studied cyclist Emma Pooley and Year I studied tennis player Billie Jean King. Year I learned about and sequenced the main events of her life and about why she is significant in campaigning for women to be equal to



men. Year 2 studied gymnast Katelyn Ohashi and Year 3 studied swimmer Ellie Simmonds. Year 3 began looking into gender stereotypes within sport and then considered how that would make current sporting figures feel. They looked at Ellie Simmonds and explored her achievements. They were really impressed and happy that she could participate in the Paralympics, not only representing her country but winning Olympic medals. Year 4 studied professional ballroom dancer Oti Mabuse and Year 5 studied Ellen MacArthur. There were so many amazing activities going on around the school from building the Blackpool Tower and designing new dancing outfits in Year 4 to creating some superb posters in Year 5. 
The Reception teachers are incredibly proud of the children's hard work and resilience this term. We hope you all have the most amazing Easter break
