

At Rugby Free Primary we try to ensure all our pupils follow our E-Safety rules carefully and understand what to do when they see something they do not like. There has been a recent increase in the number of E-Safety incidents in school. Could you all take this opportunity to talk with your children about rules to follow to keep safe and ensure that all of their online



activity is age appropriate. Games and Apps come with age restrictions that should be followed. Social media applications such as Whatsapp (16+), Facebook (13+), TikTok (13+), Youtube (13+), etc all have age limits of 13+ which means all of our children should not be using any of these unsupervised. Any activity needs to be monitored to prevent any cases of cyber bullying or exposure to inappropriate material. We thank you for your support. If you would like any tips or help with how to monitor or restrict your devices whilst still giving your children trust and freedom, we would be happy to help.
